American Goat Federation

Building Organizational Capacity to Represent, Support and Grow the U.S. Goat Industry - membership drive and administrative updating to establish the American Goat Federation - (AGF) as the voice for the industry in public policy, research, and education.

Membership drive goal to double organizational members by the end of the project.

Lamb Board Quality Audits Findings

The U.S. lamb industry cannot expect improvements in prices for its products/byproducts when "quality" doesn't warrant such increases.

". . . an industry cannot manage its quality problems until it can measure them."

The sheep industry must identify its quality shortfalls and their root causes.

Failure to prevent or correct quality problems in American Lamb will most likely result in opportunity losses and continued decline in demand.

National Sheep Improvement Program

This grant is designed to promote and educate the sheep and goat industry about the National Sheep Improvement Program.
