ATP

- ATP is a program designed to provide funding to U.S. agricultural industries impacted by tariffs to conduct activities that promote U.S. agricultural commodities in foreign markets.
- ATP provided more flexibility

2023 Farm Bill

- The current Farm Bill is set to expire October 1, 2023, which includes FAS market development funding.
- MAP funding has remained at its current level of \$200 million since 2006. After sequestration, administrative costs, and factoring in current inflation over time, the real dollar amount of the MAP funding was \$126 million for PY2022, estimated \$114 million for 2023.
- The 2023 Farm Bill is the next opportunity for Congress to increase MAP and other FAS market development program funding.
